*We revel in the loveliness present in our world, believing it is a door into worship.*

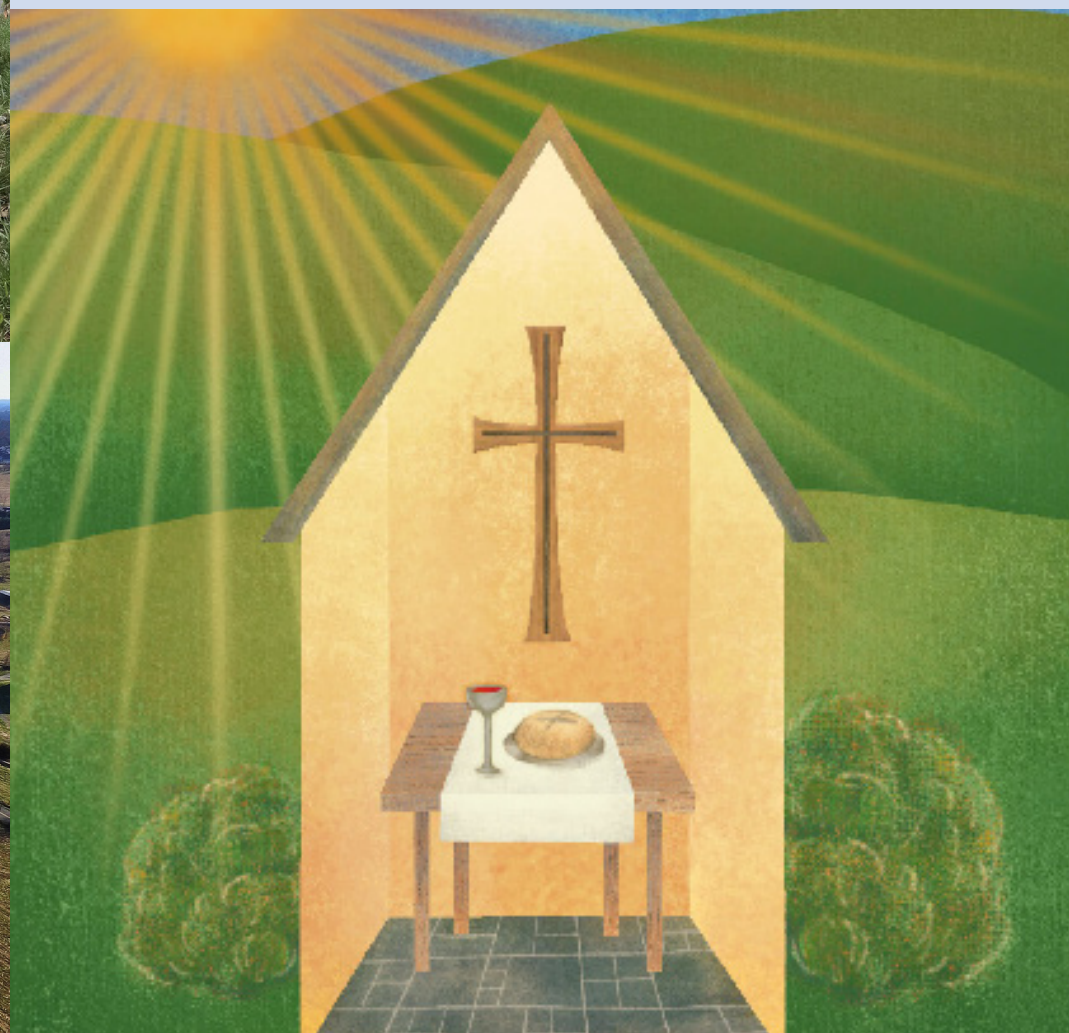

# The Abide Project

represents Church of the Lamb's vision for stewarding the gifts God entrusted to us: 31 acres of land, a parsonage, and office space.

Church of the Lamb's mission shapes the Abide Project:

*To abide as disciples of Christ:  
invited to rest & compelled to love.*

We embody the Abide Project by cultivating three spaces where deep rest and active love converge:

## *Parish*

Adoring the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit  
Welcoming our neighbors into the family of God

## *Gardens*

Offering places of delight and contemplation  
Inviting our community to enjoy the Creator and his creation

## *Abbey*

Uniting faith with work and vocation  
Providing a place for spiritual formation and healing



Our Parish, Gardens, and Abbey will emerge and develop in three phases:

## Phase 1: Growing Roots

(2021 – 2023)

- Renovate parsonage, office, and children's atrium
- Build a pavilion for worship and community use
- Begin to restore the Cub Run streambed
- Plant an orchard and native trees
- Build foot bridges
- Create spaces for prayer: walking paths with benches
- Designate a picnic and play area
- Research and develop plans for a cemetery
- Implement regenerative agricultural practices
- Plan the architecture of our church building

## Phase 2: Breaking Ground

(2024 – 2028)

- Establish a church building
- Maintain garden, orchard, streambed, walking paths, and agricultural projects
- Implement long-term agricultural projects
- Implement cemetery plans
- Offer spiritual direction and counseling on site for church and community members

## Phase 3: Harvesting Fruit

(2029 – 2031)

- Maintain garden, orchard, streambed, paths, and agricultural projects
- Commission outdoor Stations of the Cross by local artists
- Expand ministries of spiritual direction and counseling
